NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the 25th Annual General Meeting of the Company will be held at NTUC Centre, 1 Marina Boulevard, Level 7, Auditorium, Singapore 018989 on Wednesday, 24 April 2019 at 3:00 p.m. for the following purposes:

ORDINARY BUSINESS

1. To receive and adopt the Directors' statement and the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2018 together with the auditors' report thereon. **(Resolution 1)**
2. To declare a first and final (one-tier, tax exempt) dividend of S\$0.045 per ordinary share for the financial year ended 31 December 2018. **(Resolution 2)**
3. To approve Directors' fees of S\$326,553 for the financial year ended 31 December 2018 (2017: S\$326,553). **(Resolution 3)**
4. To record the retirement of Dr Wang Kai Yuen who is retiring pursuant to Regulation 94 of the Constitution of the Company and will not be seeking re-election as a Director of the Company.
5. To record the retirement of Mr Ang Swee Tian who is retiring pursuant to Regulation 94 of the Constitution of the Company and will not be seeking re-election as a Director of the Company.
6. To re-elect the following Directors, each of whom will cease to hold office in accordance with Regulation 100 of the Constitution of the Company and who, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election:

Mr Feng Hai **(Resolution 4)**
Mr Chan Yat Chung **(Resolution 5)**
7. To re-appoint Deloitte & Touche LLP as the Auditors of the Company and to authorize the Directors to fix their remuneration. **(Resolution 6)**

SPECIAL BUSINESS

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without modifications, the following resolutions as Ordinary Resolutions:

8. That pursuant to Section 161 of the Companies Act, Cap. 50 and the Listing Manual of the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited (the "SGX-ST") authority be and is hereby given to the Directors of the Company to:
 - (a) (i) issue shares in the capital of the Company ("shares") whether by way of rights, bonus or otherwise; and/or
 - (ii) make or grant offers, agreements or options (collectively, "Instruments") that might or would require shares to be issued, including but not limited to the creation and issue of (as well as adjustments to) warrants, debentures or other instruments convertible into shares,

at any time and upon such terms and conditions and for such purposes and to such persons as the Directors may in their absolute discretion deem fit; and

- (b) (notwithstanding that the authority conferred by this Resolution may have ceased to be in force) issue shares in pursuance to any Instrument made or granted by the Directors while this Resolution was in force,

Provided that:

- (1) the aggregate number of shares to be issued pursuant to this Resolution (including shares to be issued in pursuance of Instruments made or granted pursuant to this Resolution) does not exceed 50% of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company (as calculated in accordance with sub-paragraph (2) below), of which the aggregate number of shares to be issued other than on a pro-rata basis to shareholders of the Company (including shares to be issued in pursuance of Instruments made or granted pursuant to this Resolution) does not exceed 15% of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company (as calculated in accordance with sub-paragraph (2) below);
- (2) (subject to such manner of calculation as may be prescribed by the SGX-ST) for the purpose of determining the aggregate number of shares that may be issued under sub-paragraph (1) above, the percentage of issued share capital shall be based on the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company at the time of the passing of this Resolution, after adjusting for:
 - (a) new shares arising from the conversion or exercise of any convertible securities or share options or vesting of share awards which are outstanding at the time of the passing of this Resolution; and
 - (b) any subsequent consolidation or subdivision of shares;

and, in sub-paragraph (1) above and this sub-paragraph (2), “subsidiary holdings” has the meaning given to it in the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST;

- (3) in exercising the authority conferred by this Resolution, the Company shall comply with the provisions of the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST for the time being in force (unless such compliance has been waived by the SGX-ST) and the Constitution for the time being of the Company; and
- (4) (unless revoked or varied by the Company in general meeting) the authority conferred by this Resolution shall continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held, whichever is the earlier.

(Resolution 7)

9. That:

- (a) approval be and is hereby given for the renewal of the shareholders’ general mandate (which was last renewed at the annual general meeting of the Company held on 25 April 2018) for the Company, its subsidiaries and associated companies which fall within the definition of entities at risk under Chapter 9 of the Listing Manual or any of them to enter into any of the transactions falling within the categories of interested person transactions set out in Annex II to the Company’s Letter to Shareholders dated 28 March 2019 (the “**Letter**”), with any party who is of the class or classes of interested persons described in Annex II to the Letter, provided that such transactions are made

on normal commercial terms and are not prejudicial to the Company and its minority shareholders, and are entered into in accordance with the review procedures for interested person transactions as set out in Annex II to the Letter (the “**IPT Mandate**”);

- (b) the IPT Mandate shall, unless revoked or varied by the Company in a general meeting, continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or until the date on which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held, whichever is the earlier;
- (c) the audit committee of the Company (comprising Independent Directors, Mr Ang Swee Tian, Dr Wang Kai Yuen and Mr Li Runsheng, and Non-Independent, Non-Executive Directors, Mr Li Yongji and Mr Chan Yat Chung as at the date of the Letter) be and is hereby authorised to take such action as it deems proper in respect of the procedures and/or to modify or implement such procedures as may be necessary to take into consideration any amendment to Chapter 9 of the Listing Manual which may be prescribed by the SGX-ST from time to time; and
- (d) the Directors and each of them be and are hereby authorised and empowered to complete and to do all such other acts and things as they may consider necessary, desirable or expedient in the interests of the Company in connection with or for the purposes of giving full effect to the IPT Mandate.

(Resolution 8)

10. That:

- (a) for the purposes of the Companies Act (Chapter 50 of Singapore) (the “**Companies Act**”), the exercise by the Directors of all the powers of the Company to purchase or otherwise acquire fully paid issued ordinary shares in the capital of the Company (the “**Shares**”) not exceeding in aggregate the Maximum Limit (as hereafter defined), at such price or prices as may be determined by the Directors from time to time up to the Maximum Price (as hereafter defined), whether by way of:
 - (i) on-market purchase(s) on the SGX-ST and/or any other stock exchange on which the Shares may for the time being be listed and quoted (the “**Other Exchange**”); and/or
 - (ii) off-market purchase(s) if effected otherwise than on the SGX-ST or, as the case may be, the Other Exchange in accordance with any equal access scheme(s) as may be determined or formulated by the Directors as they consider fit, which scheme(s) shall satisfy all the conditions prescribed by the Companies Act;and otherwise in accordance with all other laws, regulations and rules of the SGX-ST or, as the case may be, the Other Exchange as may for the time being be applicable, be and is hereby authorised and approved generally and unconditionally (the “**Share Purchase Mandate**”);
- (b) unless varied or revoked by the Company in a general meeting, the authority conferred on the Directors pursuant to the Share Purchase Mandate may be exercised by the Directors at any time and from time to time during the period commencing from the date of the passing of this Resolution and expiring on the earlier of:
 - (i) the date on which the next annual general meeting of the Company is held; and
 - (ii) the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held; and

- (c) the Directors and each of them be and are hereby authorised and empowered to complete and to do all such other acts and things as they may consider necessary, desirable or expedient in the interests of the Company in connection with or for the purposes of giving full effect to the Share Purchase Mandate.

For the purposes of this Resolution:

“Average Closing Price” means the average of the closing market prices of the Shares over the last five (5) market days, on which transactions in the Shares on the SGX-ST were recorded, before the day on which a market purchase was made by the Company or, as the case may be, the date of the announcement of the offer pursuant to an off-market purchase, and deemed to be adjusted in accordance with the listing rules of the SGX-ST for any corporate action which occurs after the relevant period of five (5) market days;

“Maximum Limit” means that number of issued Shares representing ten per cent. (10%) of the total number of Shares of the Company (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) as at the last annual general meeting or as at the date of the passing of this Resolution (whichever is the higher); and

“Maximum Price”, in relation to a Share to be purchased or acquired, means the purchase price (excluding brokerage, stamp duties, commission, applicable goods and services tax and other related expenses) which shall not exceed:

- (a) in the case of an on-market purchase of a Share, one hundred and five per cent. (105%) of the Average Closing Price of the Shares; and
- (b) in the case of an off-market purchase of a Share pursuant to an equal access scheme, one hundred and ten per cent. (110%) of the Average Closing Price of the Shares.

(Resolution 9)

11. To transact any other ordinary business which may properly be transacted at an annual general meeting.

Notes:

1. (a) A member who is not a relevant intermediary is entitled to appoint not more than two (2) proxies to attend, speak and vote at the Annual General Meeting. Where such member’s form of proxy appoints more than one (1) proxy, the proportion of the shareholding concerned to be represented by each proxy shall be specified in the form of proxy.
- (b) A member who is a relevant intermediary is entitled to appoint more than two (2) proxies to attend, speak and vote at the Annual General Meeting, but each proxy must be appointed to exercise the rights attached to a different share or shares held by such member. Where such member’s form of proxy appoints more than two (2) proxies, the number and class of shares in relation to which each proxy has been appointed shall be specified in the form of proxy.

“**Relevant Intermediary**” has the meaning ascribed to it in Section 181 of the Companies Act, Chapter 50 of Singapore.

2. A proxy need not be a member of the Company.
3. The instrument appointing a proxy or proxies must be deposited at the Company’s registered office at 8 Temasek Boulevard, #31-02, Suntec Tower Three, Singapore 038988 not less than 72 hours before the time fixed for holding the Annual General Meeting.

Personal Data Privacy:

By submitting an instrument appointing a proxy(ies) and/or representative(s) to attend, speak and vote at the Annual General Meeting of the Company (the “**25th AGM**”) and/or any adjournment thereof, a member of the Company (i) consents to the collection, use and disclosure of the member’s personal data by the Company (or its agents) for the purpose of the processing, administration and analysis by the Company (or its agents or service providers) of proxies and representatives appointed for the 25th AGM (including any adjournment thereof) and the preparation and compilation of the attendance lists, minutes and other documents relating to the 25th AGM (including any adjournment thereof), and in order for the Company (or its agents or service providers) to comply with any applicable laws, listing rules, regulations and/or guidelines (collectively, the “**Purposes**”), (ii) warrants that where the member discloses the personal data of the member’s proxy(ies) and/or representative(s) to the Company (or its agents or service providers), the member has obtained the prior consent of such proxy(ies) and/or representative(s) for the collection, use and disclosure by the Company (or its agents or service providers) of the personal data of such proxy(ies) and/or representative(s) for the Purposes, and (iii) agrees that the member will indemnify the Company in respect of any penalties, liabilities, claims, demands, losses and damages as a result of the member’s breach of warranty.

Explanatory Notes:

Upon the retirement of Dr Wang Kai Yuen as a Non-Executive, Independent Director of the Company at the conclusion of this Annual General Meeting, Dr Wang will concurrently cease to be the Deputy Chairman, the Lead Independent Director, the Chairman of the Remuneration Committee and a member of the Audit Committee and the Nominating Committee.

Upon the retirement of Mr Ang Swee Tian as a Non-Executive, Independent Director of the Company at the conclusion of this Annual General Meeting, Mr Ang will concurrently cease to be the Chairman of the Audit Committee, and a member of the Risk Management Committee, the Remuneration Committee and the Nominating Committee.

Resolution 4 Mr Feng Hai will upon re-appointment, continue as Vice Chairman of the Nominating Committee and a member of the Risk Management Committee. He is considered a Non-Executive, Non-Independent Director. There is no change in the information relating to Mr Feng as set out in Appendix 7.4.1 of the Listing Manual of SGX-ST, which was announced by the Company on 1 November 2018.

Resolution 5 Mr Chan Yat Chung, will upon re-appointment, continue as Chairman of the Risk Management Committee and a member of the Audit Committee. He is considered a Non-Executive, Non-Independent Director. There is no change in the information relating to Mr Chan as set out in Appendix 7.4.1 of the Listing Manual of SGX-ST, which was announced by the Company on 1 November 2018 except that as from 1 January 2019, Mr Chan has assumed a new role within the BP Group as Vice President Commercial Funding-Upstream, Alternative Energy and BP Ventures (Global responsibility to arrange funding and manage financial risks for the BP Group’s Upstream, Alternative Energy and Ventures businesses).

Resolution 7 Ordinary Resolution 7 is to authorise the Directors, from the date of the above Annual General Meeting until the next annual general meeting, to issue shares in the Company. The aggregate number of shares which the Directors may issue under this Resolution shall not exceed fifty per cent (50%) of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company, of which the aggregate number of shares to be issued other than on a pro-rata basis to existing shareholders shall not exceed fifteen per cent. (15%) of the issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company. The percentage of issued share capital is based on the Company’s issued shares (excluding treasury shares and subsidiary holdings) in the capital of the Company at the time this proposed Ordinary Resolution is passed, after adjusting for (a) new shares arising from the conversion of convertible securities or share options on issue at the time this proposed Ordinary Resolution is passed; and (b) any subsequent consolidation or subdivision of shares.

Resolution 8 Ordinary Resolution 8 is to approve the renewal of the mandate to permit the Company, its subsidiaries and associated companies that are entities at risk (as that term is used in Chapter 9 of the Listing Manual of the SGX-ST), or any of them, to enter into certain types of interested person transactions with certain classes of interested persons as described in the Letter.

Resolution 9 Ordinary Resolution 9 is to renew the mandate to permit the Company to purchase or acquire issued ordinary shares in the capital of the Company on the terms and subject to the conditions of the Resolution.

The Company may use internal sources of funds, or a combination of internal resources and external borrowings, to finance the purchase or acquisition of its ordinary shares. The amount of funding required for the Company to purchase or acquire its ordinary shares and the impact on the Company's financial position cannot be ascertained as at the date of this Notice of Annual General Meeting as these will depend on the number of ordinary shares purchased or acquired and the price at which such ordinary shares were purchased or acquired and whether the ordinary shares purchased or acquired are held in treasury or cancelled. The Company will not rely on external borrowings to finance purchases or acquisitions of its ordinary shares to such extent that it would materially affect the financial position, working capital requirements or investment ability of the Group.

Regulation 94 of the Constitution of the Company

Every Director shall retire from office at least once every three (3) years and for this purpose, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation.

Regulation 100 of the Constitution of the Company

The Company may by Ordinary Resolution appoint any person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an additional Director. Without prejudice thereto, the Directors shall have power at any time so to do, but so that the total number of Directors shall not thereby exceed the maximum number (if any) fixed by or in accordance with this Constitution. Any person so appointed by the Directors shall hold office until the next annual general meeting and shall then be eligible for re-election, but shall not be taken into account in determining the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting.

Notice of Books Closure Date and Payment Date for First and Final Dividend (One-Tier, Tax-Exempt) (the "Dividend")

The Company gives notice that, subject to the approval of the shareholders being obtained for the Dividend at the 25th Annual General Meeting of the Company to be held on 24 April 2019, the Register of Members and the Transfer Books of the Company will be closed on 7 May 2019 for the preparation of dividend warrants. The Register of Members and the Transfer Books will re-open on 8 May 2019. Duly completed registered transfers of ordinary shares in the capital of the Company received by the Company's Share Registrar, Boardroom Corporate & Advisory Services Pte Ltd at 50 Raffles Place, Singapore Land Tower, #32-01, Singapore 048623 before 5.00 p.m. on 6 May 2019, will be registered in the Register of Members and the Transfer Books of the Company to determine shareholders' entitlements to the Dividend. In respect of ordinary shares in securities accounts with The Central Depository (Pte) Limited ("**CDP**"), the Dividend will be paid by the Company to CDP which will, in turn, distribute the entitlements to the Dividend to CDP account-holders in accordance with its normal practice.

The Dividend, if approved by shareholders, will be paid on 15 May 2019.
